Caught a scam artist in a sting operation this month...He came to me with a story about a destitute family needing emergency surgery on their son. I gave him some money but when he called the next day asking for more, I became suspicious and called the police. They set up a 'sting operation' and when he arrived for the next handout, he was arrested. Turned out he has been pulling scams like this for years...
